Stratham – Andrew (“Andy”) David Silberdick, 42, of Stratham passed away of a sudden and unexpected cardiac event June 14, 2020. He was born in Hanover on May 16, 1978, a son of Norman Silberdick of Hampton and Kathleen Hudson of Dover. Andrew shared 12 years of marriage with his beloved wife, Caroline Lawless.

Andrew grew up in Bellows Falls, VT and the Seacoast of NH. The family moved to Hampton in 1995. Andy graduated from Winnacunnet High School in 1996 where he played hockey at WHS for three years and with his brother Aaron, started the WHS lacrosse Club. While at UNH, he took a position with Jones & Company of Newport Beach, CA as an institutional stock trader working in both the Boston and Portsmouth offices where he worked for the last 20 years.
