



Calvin C. Rollins

February 24, 1927 - January 11, 2022

Brentwood, NH – Calvin C. Rollins, 94, of Brentwood, and a former resident of Epping, NH, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, January 11, 2022.

Calvin was born on February 24, 1927 in Raymond, NH, a son of the late George Addison and Mary Ann (Leighton) Rollins. Calvin and his late wife, Elinor (Boulton) Rollins, shared over 54 years together before her passing in January 2021.

Calvin was raised in Raymond on his family's farm, where hard work was a way of life. With World War II in full throes and feeling the pull of service, Calvin left high school before graduation and enlisted in the Navy in December 1944. Among other duties, he was stationed on the USS SABINE, which supported various operations in the Pacific theater. Following the end of the war, the ship and her crew were sent for a period to the Yangtze River, an experience Calvin remembered and described vividly in later years. Calvin was honorably discharged from the Navy in July 1946 and returned to Raymond, where he obtained his diploma from Raymond High School in June 1947.

Over the next several years, Calvin worked for various local businesses in and around Raymond, where he acquired and refined trade skills including as a mechanic, carpenter and draftsman. He eventually went into business for himself as a carpenter-builder, where he found success working on a variety of residential and commercial projects throughout southeastern New Hampshire and on Cape Cod, MA. Calvin's keen eye for detail, meticulous approach, honesty and easy-going nature were appreciated by his clients, several of whom also became good friends.

Calvin continued working until he was nearly 80 years old, by which point he and Elinor had relocated to Utah. Not content to relax in retirement, Calvin tinkered and puttered, renovating and tending to a series of homes in both Utah and, later, New Hampshire. Always friendly and smiling, Calvin was nonetheless a quiet, private person who loved his family, the outdoors, history and caring for his cats.

Calvin is survived by his daughters, Katherine Lofft (together with husband, Alexander) of Washington, DC and Diane Feissel of Gloucester City, NJ. In addition to his beloved wife, Elinor, Calvin was predeceased by his parents, his brothers William, Arthur, Warren and Charles, and his sister, Ruth.
