



## Carl W. Seyfarth

October 18, 1940 - August 25, 2017

Rye – Carl W. Seyfarth, 76, of Rye, died Friday, August 25, 2017 at Frisbee Memorial Hospital in Rochester after a period of failing health.

He was born in Manchester, October 18, 1940 the son of the late Hans and Anna (Hager) Seyfarth.

He attended local Manchester schools and graduated from Manchester West High School. Carl was a veteran serving with the US Navy for over 23 years retiring as a Senior Chief Petty Officer.

After his retirement from the service his second career was with Sodexo Food Services as a chef and finally with the NH Liquor Commission working in the Portsmouth and I-95 stores.
