Rye Beach – Allan B. Rogers Jr., 61, of Rye Beach, passed away unexpectedly on Thursday, November 7, 2019.

He was born in Lawrence, MA on November 13, 1957 a son of Joyce (Demers) Phinney of Seabrook Beach and the late Allan B Rogers. Raised in Andover, MA he graduated from the Brooks School and the University of Vermont.

For the last 20 plus years, Allan was a very successful Realtor on the New Hampshire Seacoast, most recently with Carey & Giampa Realtors and previously with Bentley By The Sea.

He was predeceased in 2012 by his wife and best friend, Cara Jean (Brown) Rogers.

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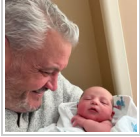

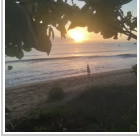
