Berwick, ME – Amanda S. Hill, 42, of Berwick, formerly of Amesbury, MA, passed away Friday, June 25, 2021, surrounded by love, with family and friends by her side, at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, MA after a courageous battle with cancer. She was born in Boston, September 12, 1978.

Amanda was raised in Norwell, MA, Dover, NH and Sanford, ME. After graduating from Sanford High School, as part of the class of 1996, she pursued her bachelor's degree from the University of Southern New Hampshire.

She leaves her mother Paula J. (Bertsch) Kimball and her Step Father Wayne of Berwick, ME along with her brother, Matthew Hill and his wife Marianne Hallak and their 2 children, Mike-Anthony and Jason, all of Herndon, VA.

She was predeceased by her father David A. Hill.

Prior to her illness she was passionate about her career in sales with Covetrus, an equine pharmaceutical manufacturer based in Portland. She devoted her life to the equine community and specifically the Morgan horse breed. She worked tirelessly to expand the Morgan breed to younger generations of horse lovers. Above all else, Amanda leaves behind a strong network of friends from every corner of her life. She was unquestionably known as a trusted, loyal confidant who cared deeply and always went above and beyond for everyone. As a daughter and sister, Amanda was the light of her family which shall never burn out.
