Rye – Barbara Ann Bird, 88, formerly of Atkinson, NH, passed away peacefully on Sunday, March 4, 2018 at Webster at Rye where she had been living since falling ill.

She was born in Haverhill, MA, August 20, 1929, a daughter of the late John and Lydia (Tardiff) Conway.

Barbara was raised in Haverhill and graduated from Haverhill High School with the Class of 1947. She went on to attend Boston University before marrying the love of her life, Leonard A. Bird.
