November 14, 1930 - July 2, 2014

Dover – Bernard L. “Ben” Arguin, 83, formerly of Hampton, died peacefully Wednesday, July 2, 2014 at Strafford County Nursing Home in Dover, with his wife and daughters by his side.

He was born in Berlin, November 14, 1930 a son of the late Willie N. and AnnMarie (Gosselin) Arguin. He graduated from Notre Dame High School and was a veteran of the Korean War serving with the US Army.

Ben excelled in hockey and played for the Berlin Maroons and was later inducted into the New Hampshire Hockey Hall of Fame in 2005.

He was employed as a sales representative for HD Baumann, Inc. of Portsmouth a manufacturer of valves for many years as well as GTE Sylvania in Exeter prior to that.

Ben moved to Hampton in 1966 coming from Berlin and was a communicant of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal Parish, OLMN Men’s Choir, Holy Name Society and St. Vincent de Paul Society. He was also a member of the Hampton’s American Legion Post 35.

He was an avid Montreal Canadian and Boston Red Sox fan.

He shared nearly 62 years of marriage with his wife, Margaret M. (Ottolini) Arguin.

In addition to his wife, family members include two daughters, Audrey A. Arguin and her husband C.E. "Mac" McGinley of Bethel, ME, Amy A. Pender and her husband Jim of Hampton, six grandchildren, Abigail and Anna Pender, Alison, Timothy Erica and Nathan Arguin, two great grandchildren, Mason Giles and Ava Arguin, two step granddaughters, three great step great grandchildren, nieces and nephews.

He was predeceased by his son Peter Arguin in 2007.
