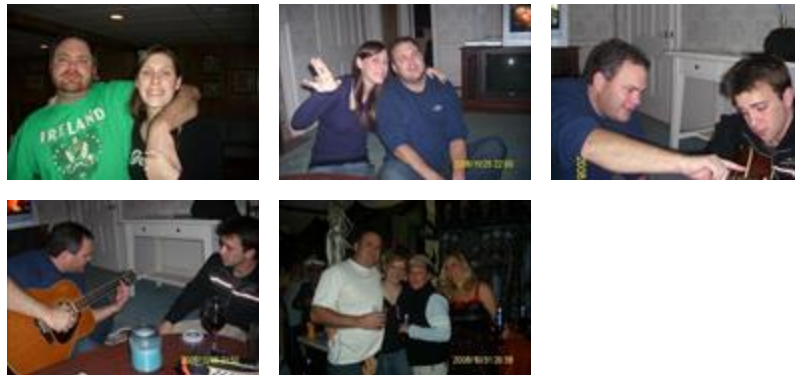

I will always have a place in my heart for the best male friend I have ever had and probably will ever have. I just wish I would have had a little longer to show him, tell him, prove to him that he was awesome, special and irreplaceable. He always underestimated his worth. He never really believed all the hype about how special he was and across the board everyone that knew him thought so highly of his character. I miss him even now. Haven't spoken in a couple years but every time we reconnected it was like nothing had changed. We went right back to hanging out like we had been doing it everyday. Never any crap or small talk either. Bryan was a man of substance and a great conversationalist. The world is a darker place without him in it. Love you to the moon and back my friend!
