



Rev. Carroll C. Moore

April 9, 1941 - September 30, 2025

Nottingham- Reverend Carroll Charles Moore, beloved minister of the United Methodist Church, passed away on September 30, 2025, in Fremont, New Hampshire, at the age of 84.

Born on April 9, 1941, in Dummerston, Vermont, Carroll dedicated his life to his faith and family. He was a cherished son of Donald and Eloise Moore of St. Albans, Vermont. He was preceded in death by his parents, his brother, Dwane, and sister, Averill Heald. He is survived by his brother Ellsworth of Myrtle Beach, and sister Judy Luneau of Sheldon, Vermont, as well as many nieces and nephews. Carroll was a devoted husband to Lora Wiard whom he married in 1966. His legacy lives on through his three sons: Martin of Bend OR, Daniel and his wife Marcie of Peterborough NH, and Michael and his wife Melisa of Meredith NH, and eight grandchildren.

Carroll was ordained in the United Methodist Church in 1966 and pastored until his final retirement in 2025. Over those years Carroll served more than 15 churches across New Hampshire, Massachusetts, and Michigan. He also led the Parish of the Headwaters in northern New Hampshire and Vermont. Carroll used his talent as a story-teller to connect deeply with his congregations. His ministry went beyond the pulpit; he built connections through golf, Bible studies, youth camps, and retreats. Friends remember him as compassionate, caring, and easy-going. He had a great sense of humor.

Carroll had a special fondness for Mark Twain. He portrayed Twain in costume, offering a presentation of Twain's works to his audience. He also portrayed John Wesley, participated in a clown ministry, and acted in several Epping community plays. Other passions were the Boston Red Sox and Celtics teams, traveling, enjoying the outdoors, his gardens, and running (he finished 30 marathons, and jogged each and every day - 2,286 consecutively - beginning from November 1, 1982).

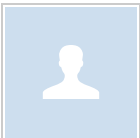

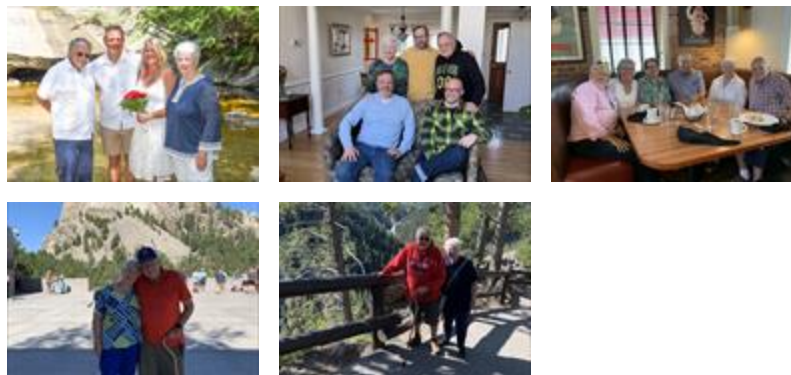
