Rye – Charles E. “Chuck” Rand, Jr. died Thursday, August 29, 2013 at his home with his wife, Sandra (Snyder) Rand at his side and surrounded by family.

Mr. Rand was born in Portsmouth May 14, 1962 the son of Nancy (Thompson) Rand and the late Charles E. Rand Sr. of Rye. Chuck graduated from UNH in 1984, from Portsmouth High School in 1980, and was a member of the Marching Band.
