

## Clarence "Babe" Sawyer, Jr.

January 1, 1933 - May 17, 2022

Hampton, NH – Clarence Foster “Babe” Sawyer, Jr., 89, of Hampton, formerly of Lynn, MA, passed peacefully Tuesday, May 17, 2022 at Cornerstone. He was born in Lynn, MA January 1, 1933, son of the late Clarence F. and Hazel (Clark) Sawyer.

Babe was raised in Saugus, MA and graduated from Saugus High School and later graduated from Wentworth Institute. He served proudly with the US Navy during the Korean War. Babe was employed as a machinist first at the United Shoe in Beverly and then later for General Electric Corporation in Lynn for over 35 years before retiring in 1994.

Babe was predeceased by his second wife Mary (Casey) Sawyer in 2019 and his first wife Mary B. (Hennessy) Sawyer in 1975.

He was also an avid cribbage player. Babe was able to continue this passion with his close friend Jim. They've been playing at least twice a week for the past three years and had a friendly rivalry which they both enjoyed.

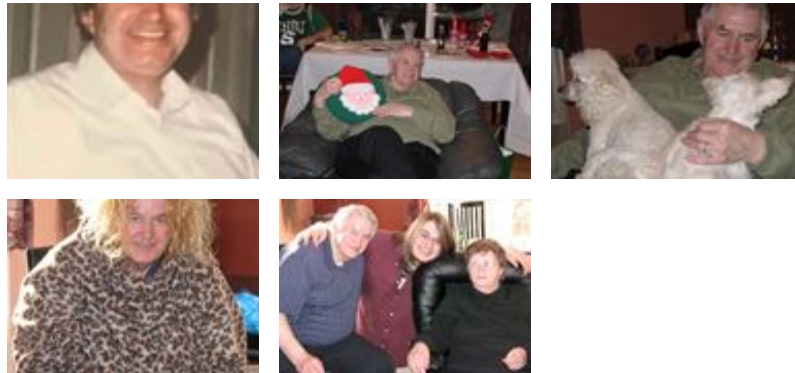

“ I have so many wonderful memories of my dad. It’s hard to choose. My favorite memories are the funny ones, especially those that involved my cooking. He even warned my husband, Jude, when he FIRST met him, “Just in case you’re wondering, she’s a lousy cook”, but I’m getting ahead of myself.



So my first real chance to show off my cooking skills was a few months after he married my stepmom, Mary. I was fifteen at that time. They had a big argument and she stormed out of the house. I said to my dad, let her go, I can cook our meals! Then I proceeded to cook roast chicken for dinner. How was I to know a chicken needs more than 20 minutes to cook at 500 degrees, or that they stick a plastic bag with icky parts inside? I saw it, but had no idea it needed to come out. I’ll never forget his face when he cut into the chicken and it was completely raw inside (though it was golden brown on the outside!), then he noticed the singed plastic. Needless to say, he chased after my stepmom and they resolved their differences. How was I to know how to cook a chicken or anything else? The closest I’d been to cooking was my toaster and even then I burned my cinnamon toast.

My dad’s culinary adventures didn’t end there. He enjoyed other mouthwatering delights along the way, such as beet greens cooked in muddy water, courtesy of my sister, Sue, hacked up turkey and other strange creations. He also didn’t trust my dishwashing skills, and for many years brought along his own dinnerware and utensils to dine.

Somewhere along the way I learned to cook and he learned to trust me. I looked forward to making our holiday meals each year and loved watching him eat.....he always asked for seconds :-)
