Hampton – David L. Gray, 89, of Hampton died Wednesday, August 28, 2019 at Oceanside Skilled Nursing and Rehabilitation. He was born in Brockton, MA February 24, 1930 a son of the late Stanley and Hazel (Brown) Gray.
