Seabrook – Dietmar “Pete” Peterson, 69, of Seabrook and a former longtime resident of Oak Ridge, NJ, passed away peacefully with loving family surrounding his bedside on Monday, March 1, 2021. Dietmar was born in Steyr, Austria on June 30, 1951, a son of the late Charles and Lucia (Kreiner) Peterson. He shared over 47 years of marriage with his beloved wife, Laura L. (Baker) Peterson.

Dietmar was proud of his Austrian and German heritage. He traveled around the world as a Sales Manager in the semi-conductor industry for TSK America. He retired in 2014 after more than 38 years with the company. He also served as a volunteer firefighter for the Jefferson Township Fire Department Co #1 for several years.

A man of many interests and loves, he enjoyed traveling with Laura, cooking for his family (especially schnitzel), woodworking, landscape design, fishing, being with nature - walking the rail trails and state parks, renovating his and his kid’s homes, collecting, beer, bird watching, blueberry pie, milkshakes and his 1970 Boss 302 Mustang. Additionally, Dietmar loved his New York sports teams including the Rangers and Giants but baseball was his true passion and he loved the Yankees with Mickey Mantle being one of his early idols.

Above all else, Dietmar was a family man. Whether it was boat rides, coaching, being a scoutmaster, working puzzles, fishing, camping or traveling, time with family were the happiest times of his life.

In addition to his wife Laura, surviving family members include his son Christopher Peterson and his wife, Elizabeth of Stratham, his daughter, Adrienne Jones and her husband, Brendan of Hampton and his 6 grandchildren, Bridget, Morgan, Ryan, Kelsey, Lucia and Greta who affectionately referred to him as "Pa." He also leaves his brother Steven Peterson and his wife Michelle, his nephew Bradley and his niece Emily. Dietmar was a loving husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle and friend and he will be deeply missed.

“ *Dietmar was my only Brother, Mentor and Buddy.*

We are the sons of a WWII US army veteran and Mother who grew up under Nazi suppression in Austria. We learned of all the hardships they lived through – growing up then was different than it is today. It was a real-life adventure.

We did everything together. We rode bikes, hiked, skated, skied, played ball, built models, launched rockets, flew kites, played cowboys and Indians, attacked the Germans in the back yard bunkers and had battles with our toy soldiers routinely but especially on Fourth of July and after snow storms (The Bulge) - there were real explosions and fires as we blew up their hiding places in the sandbox and bushes!

Then came go carts, High School, beer and cars. We went to races at Flemington and later worked on a dirt car that I had picked up. He helped me build the house for our Father who became ill and wheel chair bound and I helped him with his first home. All through these experiences he was the Big Brother who taught me the things that got me going like learning how to do electrical work.

Then came time for our own families and as is often the case, we went about doing our own things. Throughout these years I thought about him and how we would get a chance to get together again and talk about our own adventures and maybe have some new ones, but Time had another plan.

No matter how old you get, it's always too soon to leave. My biggest regret is not taking the time to start sharing our experiences again – we had time, I thought.

Now he is gone from our existence, but lives on as long as he remains in our memories - and what wonderful memories they are. We had great lives together and in time the rest of us will follow.

Dietmar you will be missed forever and I wish you fair weather, tail winds and God's Speed in your journey. Just maybe – we'll meet again.
