Hampton – Donald E. Lewis, 68, of Hampton, died suddenly on Thursday, June 4, 2020.

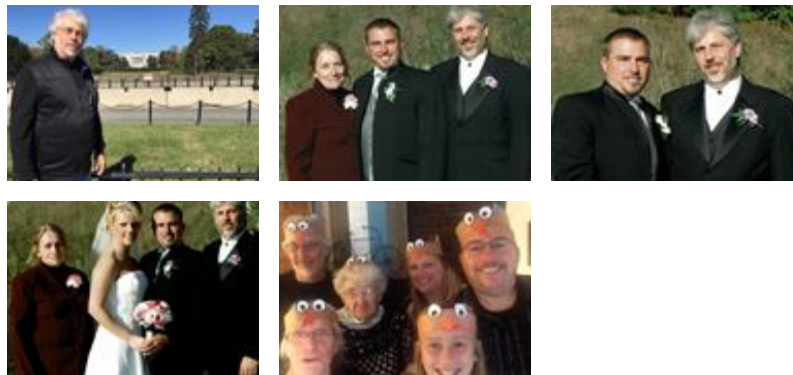
