Hooksett – Donald L. Pryor, 75, of Hooksett, formerly of Auburn, passed away on Wednesday, June 12, 2024.

He was born in Exeter, NH on September 11, 1948 a son of the late Charles and Dorothy (Griffin) Pryor. Raised in Hampton, he graduated from Winnacunnet High School with the Class of 1966 and went to receive his bachelor's degree from Northeastern University.

Don worked as a Senior Industrial/Manufacturing Engineer for several different companies between 1987-2002. When the need for engineers declined, he turned to teaching with the Manchester School District. He received his teaching Certificate from Granite State College and taught Mathematics at West High School until his retirement.

During the summer months, Don worked as a tutor. He was fond of his dog, Allie and supported local rescues and animal welfare groups.
