Hampton - Doris I. Broderick, 96, of Hampton, died March 15, 2022 at her home after a period of failing health. She was born in Brooklyn, NY October 8, 1925, the daughter of the late, John T. and Helvig (Olsen) Eskeland.

Mrs. Broderick was a graduate of Erasmus Hall High School in Brooklyn, attended business school, and enlisted in the Cadet Nurse Corps.

Prior to raising her family, Mrs. Broderick worked as a medical secretary. She was a communicant of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal Parish, and a member of the former Catholic Woman's Club, enjoyed cooking, knitting, and painting.

Married in 1945, she shared 70 years of marriage with her late husband, Richard A. Broderick who predeceased her in 2015.
