North Hampton – E. Vernon “Vern” Wilcox, 88, of North Hampton, died Thursday, August 1, 2013 at his home with family by his side.

He was born in Gloucester, Mass., March 7, 1925 a son of the late Hugh and Edytha (Jones) Wilcox.

Mr. Wilcox was a veteran of WW II and Korea. He joined the Navy at age 17 and served proudly for over thirty years retiring as Master Chief. He then served with the US Army Reserves for ten years retiring with over 40 years of service.

He was a member of the Hampton’s American Legion Post 35, active with the Navy Sea Cadets, and the Navy Young Marines. He made his home in North Hampton the past 40 years.

Mr. Wilcox was the husband of the late Barbara A. (Walker) Wilcox who predeceased him in 2007.

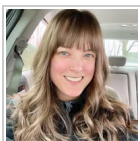

Susan and family, my prayers are with you during this difficult time. May he Lord keep you strong and may His light shine down upon you.

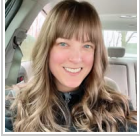
