Seabrook Beach – Edmund F. “Ted” Xavier, 78, of Seabrook Beach, passed peacefully Sunday, October 23, 2022 at his home with family by his side. He was born April 16, 1944 in Yonkers, New York a son of the late Edmund F. and Grace (Olsen) Xavier.

Ted was raised in Yonkers and Point Lookout, New York and graduated from St. Agnes High School with the Class of 1962. He later attended Villanova University in Villanova, PA and South Hampton College on Long Island, NY.
