Hampton – Edward J. D'Addario, 25, a longtime Seacoast resident, died Sunday, August 4, 2013 after a lengthy battle with cancer.

He was born December 9, 1987 in Cambridge, MA the son of Laurie (MacKay) D'Addario of Concord, MA and the late Edward M. D'Addario.

He had been a broadcast intern for WNHN 94.7 FM in Concord and had previously worked at the Visa and Passport Center in Portsmouth, for 1-800 got-junk and as a personal trainer.

Mr. D'Addario was a 2006 graduate of Winnacunnet High School and attended St. Anselm's College in Manchester. He was a member "Little Warriors" football team and later played for the State Championship Winnacunnet Warriors Team. He played little league baseball all the way to Cooperstown, NY and played hockey. Eddy also coached football in the towns of Epping and Hampton.

In addition to his mother, family members include two sisters, Kristin Schrempf, her husband, Ricky, and their children, Hunter, Lucas and Charlotte of Kingston and Sara Dillon, her husband, Tim, and their son, Erik of Nashua, his paternal grandmother, Sara D'Addario of Seabrook and Del Ray Beach, FL, maternal grandmother, Elizabeth MacKay of Methuen, MA and several

aunts, uncles and cousins.
