December 9, 1925 - June 26, 2017

Rye – Edward J. McCarthy, 91, of Rye, died peacefully on Monday, June 26, 2017 at Rochester Manor.

He was born in Charlestown, MA on December 9, 1925 a son of the late Harold and Mary E. (Babin) Lincoln.

Mr. McCarthy served in the U.S. Navy during WWII, serving during the Asiatic and Philippine Campaign onboard the U.S.S. DuPage (APA-41), which was hit by a Japanese kamikaze, killing 35 sailors and injuring 160.

After his time in service, Edward returned home and worked for Teamsters local #25 and later in the tile industry.

Surviving family members include his wife Irene (Barron) McCarthy; children, Daniel McCarthy of Mashpee MA; Cynthia A. Irwin of Sagamore Beach, MA; siblings, Mary Duncan, Nancy Colby and her husband William, Elizabeth Woodward and her husband David, Robert Lincoln and his wife Jean, Stephen Lincoln and his wife Carla; stepchildren, Ken Parlee and his wife Deborah, Steven Parlee, Donald Matthews and his wife Christine and grandchildren, Kim Laing, Ken Parlee, Kasey Flowers and Kevin Parlee.

In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by his daughter Suzanne M.

McCarthy; siblings, Thomas McCarthy, Richard McCarthy, James Lincoln, Claire Lincoln, Barbara Lima, Carol DeGaetano, June LeBert and brother in law Lawrence Duncan.
