Hampton – Edwin J. Schneider, 92, of Hampton, passed away at Exeter Hospital peacefully after being admitted Thanksgiving morning, following years of declining health.

Survivors include his beloved wife Maureen of Hampton, a daughter Alyce Morris and her husband Christopher, their children Freya and Logan Whittaker all of Portsmouth and grandson Daumanic Fucile of Seabrook.

He was predeceased by his daughter Amy Perkins in 2014 and by his four younger siblings.

Ed was a proud Navy veteran serving on the USS Charles R. Ware (DD 865). Through the years he continued contact with his shipmates via membership in the Ware Association and the yearly Ware Newsletter, “Keeping the Ware Legacy Alive”. The Ware has a permanent depository of memorabilia at the Heritage Museum in Athens, TN. Ed’s extensive collection will be forwarded to the museum in his honor for display.

After moving to the seacoast in 1978, Ed was employed by Laurel Farms in Brentwood and then Roderick Wholesale Flowers in Kingston before becoming a local distributor for Matco Tools.

Simplest pleasures in life brought great joy to Ed from living on the seacoast and spending time at their vacation home on a lake in Vermont, immense pride in the accomplishments of his grandchildren and nurturing them throughout their stages in life. During the many health challenges over the years he showed courage with a smile, sense of humor and stayed strong to the end, grateful for the love and comfort of neighbors and friends, family and numerous health care providers that came to the home over the years. Remembered and cherished by all sweet, beautiful, humble man.

Ed made his end life arrangements known prior, that he wished to have a private family graveside ceremony with military presence, no visiting hours. This will take place in the High Street Cemetery in Hampton. Arrangements are by the Remick & Gendron Funeral Home-Crematory, Hampton.
