



Eldridge G. "El" Lindsey

June 16, 1931 - October 9, 2014

Indianapolis, IN – Eldridge “El” Lindsey, 83, of Indianapolis, IN, formerly of Hampton, NH died following a long and courageous battle with cancer.

El was born June 16, 1931 in Hampton, a son of the late Clifford G. and Dorothy (Eldridge) Lindsey.

He was raised in Hampton and was a graduate of Hampton Academy with the Class of 1949. El was an outstanding athlete and was a member of the undefeated school football team and leading scorer of the Tournament Basketball Team. He was also a class officer, a member of musical activities while in high school and wrote the Class of 1949 song. El had worked at Lamie’s Tavern and the Hampton Beach Post Office during his summers.

El went on to earn his degree from Springfield College in Massachusetts and served in the United States Army during the Korean War. After the war, El went into the insurance business which prompted his move to Indianapolis in the 1950s where he lived until the time of his death. El possessed an outgoing personality, an endless energy, and was a great story teller. He was a true friend and over the years he maintained contact with his Hampton roots and his many friends in New Hampshire. While living in Indianapolis, El was a member of the Old Orchard Golf Club, the American Business Club of Indianapolis, and a member of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite and the

Royal Order of Jesters while being a member of the Murat Shriners for over 55 years. He will be sadly missed.

A graveside service with full military honors will be held at 11:30 AM on Thursday, November 13, 2014 in the High Street Cemetery, Hampton. Friends are respectfully invited.
