Epping – Elinor R. Rollins, 78, of Epping, formerly of Fremont, died peacefully on Sunday, January 17, 2021, at home surrounded by her loving family.

Elinor was born in Cambridge, MA on September 27, 1942, a daughter of the late Gilbert J. and Ruth (O’Hearn) Boulton. Raised in Raymond, NH, she graduated from Raymond High School with the class of 1960. She successfully completed business courses at Hesser Business College in 1961.

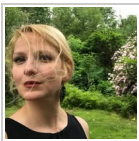
