Seabrook – Floyd M. Jones, 84, of Seabrook, passed away Tuesday, December 23, 2014 at Brigham & Women’s Hospital in Boston, Mass.

He was born July 6, 1930 in Seabrook a son of the late Howard L. and Gladys B. (Locke) Jones. He attended Seabrook schools and Amesbury, Mass., High School.

Floyd joined the U.S. Navy in 1951. He was a Third Class Engineman aboard the USS Essex LST 983 and he loved talking about his years in the Navy.

He was employed at Welpro Shoe Company in Seabrook for many years until it closed in the early 80’s. From there he worked at the Seabrook Power Plant and then at Yankee Greyhound where he retired as a security guard.

He was a lifetime member and past commander of the Raymond E. Walton American Legion Post 70, as well as a lifetime member of the Seabrook Fireman’s Association. He enjoyed camping with his family in the White Mountains, and had a lifetime love with the ocean. He was an avid lobsterman in the summer and enjoyed smelt fishing in the winter. He also would enjoy taking his Boston Terrier “Dutchy” for rides and walks along Seabrook Harbor, and tinkering in his barn was a favorite pastime.

Floyd was a 25 year member of St. James Lodge #102 F. & A.M. of Hampton, Scottish Rite Bodies, Valley of Portsmouth and Dover, and member and past president of the East Gate Club. He was Bingo manager for Post 70 on Tuesday nights and for the Fireman's Assoc. on Saturday nights for 33 years, leaving that position in 2013 due to illness.

He shared over 50 wonderful years of marriage with his wife the late Edith A. (Noyes) Jones who predeceased him in 2012.

He leaves his loving daughter, Tracy A. Jones and her fiancé, Charles H. Marshall, Jr., his loving companion, Joan Knowles, his grandchildren, Brandon, Greg, and Brianna Jones, two step grandchildren, three great grandchildren, his close friend, Bill Krippendorf, whom he thought of as a son, several nieces and nephews, along with his dog Dutchy.

In addition to his wife, he was predeceased by two sons, Floyd T. and Glenn A. Jones, his stepdaughter, Diana M. Broyer and his brother Victor L. Jones.
