



Fred W. McIntyre

October 30, 1933 - September 25, 2025

Hampton- Fred W. McIntyre, 91, of Hampton, NH passed away peacefully at home on Thursday September 25th surrounded by his loving family after a long battle with Alzheimer's.

Fred was born on October 30, 1933 in Warren, Pennsylvania, son of the late Hazel (Pillings) and Colonial McIntyre. He was predeceased by his wife S. Lorraine (Kordires) McIntyre in 2019, his parents Hazel and Colonial McIntyre, his stepdad Lloyd Dyer, his brother David and his four sisters Margaret, Millie, Marie and Kaye.

Fred joined the United States Navy as a young man and remained dedicated until a back injury rendered him unable to continue his military service. Despite this setback, he maintained his active lifestyle and unwavering patriotism. Fred was an ardent member of the American Legion Post 51 in Epping, New Hampshire, serving as Commander on two occasions. Throughout his tenure, he consistently contributed to the planning and execution of events organized by the legion. Fred was a proud veteran.

Fred married S. Lorraine Kordires on July 10, 1957. They had two daughters, Laurie McIntyre Therrien and Lisa McIntyre, whom Fred loved dearly. They lived in Everett, MA before moving to Epping, NH in 1966. While in Everett, Fred worked at the Watertown Arsenal. Once they moved to Epping, Fred worked at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard until he retired. Lorraine and Fred remained in Epping until they moved to Hampton, NH with their daughter Lisa in 2019.

Fred was a devoted outdoorsman. He loved fishing, hunting, and spending time with his horses. His love of horses included, raising, training, and showing them off with pride. But what truly made Fred special was his warm and friendly nature. Everyone who knew him loved him dearly. He was always there to lend a helping hand whenever needed.

Fred will be sadly missed and lovingly remembered by his brother Jerry McIntyre of Pennsylvania, his daughters Laurie Therrien and her husband Wayne of Rochester, NH

and Lisa McIntyre and her husband Victor Chirinos of Hampton, NH, his granddaughter Stacy Therrian and two great-grandsons, Jaxon and Mason Bower-Therrian of Aurora, CO. 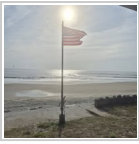
