



## Fred J. Schaake Sr.

February 1, 1924 - March 21, 2014

Hampton - Fred J. Schaake, Sr., 90, of Hampton, passed away peacefully Friday, March 21, 2014, at home.

Fred was born in Lawrence, Mass., February 1, 1924 a son of the late Ralph R. and Vernice (Bradstreet ) Schaake

He graduated from Lawrence High School and went on to Louisiana State University before being deployed to Europe by the US Army to serve in World War II. Fred was captured in the Battle of the Bulge and was a POW before being released in April of 1945.

He went on to graduate from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst, and then moved to the seacoast area where he summered as a child. After a short time as a seasonal business owner at Hampton Beach, he began a long and successful career as developer in Seabrook Beach and Hampton. Highlights of Fred's career include the development of Glen Hill, the purchase of the Hampton Beach Casino with a group of partners, and the building of the Hampton House Hotel. His love of his family and the community was evident in everything he did.

Fred is survived by his wife of 53 years, Elaine (Goodreau) Schaake, as well as their four children: Kara Schaake, Fred Schaake and his wife Leah, Keri

Hepburn and her husband Tim, Kristin Schaaque-MacKinnon and her husband Scott, all of Hampton, his loving grandchildren: Sarah and Michael Trainor, Freddy, Jack, Lucas, and Joshua Schaaque, Nick and Lindsey Hepburn, as well as many loving nieces and nephews.

In addition to his parents, Fred was predeceased by his brother, Ralph Schaaque, Jr.

The family will receive friends from 12-3 and 5-8 P.M. Friday, March 28, 2014 at the Remick & Gendron Funeral Home-Crematory, 811 Lafayette Road, Hampton.
