Seabrook – Gail L. Souther, 75, of Seabrook, passed away peacefully on Monday, April 1, 2019.

She was born in Amesbury, MA on April 21, 1943, the daughter of the late Philip and Louise (Currier) Corbin.

Raised in East Kingston and later Amesbury, MA, she graduated from Amesbury High School with the Class of 1961.

Gail dedicated her life to raising her family and later in life worked for Community Action in Haverhill as a secretary for nearly 25 years, retiring in 2017.

Surviving family members include her husband of 54 years, Alan Souther of Seabrook; son, Jeffrey Souther of Newbury, MA; grandchildren, Travis Souther and his wife Marissa of Amesbury, Tyler Souther of Newburyport and Trevor Souther of Newbury; and great granddaughter, Hayden.

She "ran" the main switchboard, effectively linking callers with over 100 staff, as well as greeting walk-in visitors just inside the main entrance. This is no easy task. I can safely say that not many staff members feel comfortable with or capable of doing it. Frequently, several people phone in and more come through the door simultaneously. Because CAI is a complex organization, with many different departments and programs, callers and visitors don't always know exactly who or what to ask for. And because many of the callers and visitors face serious human challenges like hunger, homelessness, loneliness and trauma; many want and need to share their stories, often not realizing that Gail might be balancing similar needs of several others at the same time. Gail was great in a caring way with helping people figure out how we might be able to help. The tributes also show how much she was at the heart of CAI. Gail had a smile for everyone, even just through her voice and manner on the phone; and she treated callers and visitors with the respect and courtesy that each deserved.
