George received his private pilot's license in 1972 and served as President of the Flying 20 Club in Danbury, CT for over 10 years. George enjoyed a full life of travel, golf, and building three homes. The last home, complete with landing strip, was in Chester, NH. He spent many happy vacations with his family in

Chatham, MA and Ogunquit, ME and in recent years he and Betsy spent winters traveling and exploring.
