Hampton - Gwendolyn Hurd, passed away on Thursday July 20th 2023 at the age of 94. Gwendolyn was a longtime Hampton resident, and passed peacefully at the Oceanside Nursing and Rehabilitation center.

Born in Fitchburg, MA, on April 13, 1929, Gwen was the daughter of the late Edwin and Blanche (Locke) Remal.
