Hampton —Helen S. Carrier, 92, of Hampton, formerly of Manchester, passed away peacefully on January 17, 2024.

She was born in Raymond on December 23, 1931, daughter of the late Andrew and Anastasia (Zioze) Fasekis.

Helen was raised in Raymond where her parents owned and operated the former Raymond Fruit Company for many years. She graduated from Raymond High School and Fisher Junior College and soon after married her future husband of 36 years, the late Andre D. Carrier, and together they moved to Manchester where they raised their family. A dedicated homemaker first and foremost, she also worked as a receptionist at the dental office of Dr. Gerald Beaulieu, in Manchester, and later in retail, retiring at the age of 82 as an associate at the Gap.

Her passion was her family, especially her grandchildren, whom she referred to as her “greatest achievements.” She was known for her extraordinary cooking and baking and celebrated every birthday with one of her famous cakes. She was quick to laugh, never short on conversation, and made many friends, most recently at Cornerstone of Hampton where she lived happily for the last several years of her life.

Surviving family members include her children, Deb Callahan and her husband Kevin of New Castle, Sharon Paster and her husband Bruce of Hampton, Lissa Farbotko and her husband Bob of Hampton, and AJ Carrier and his wife Mary of Rexford, NY; nine grandchildren, Emily, Brennan, Hanna, Bryce, Gabriel, Matthew, Melanie, Allison, Stephanie, and 5 great grandchildren. In addition to her parents and husband, she was predeceased by her sister, Effie Fasekis. Additionally, she leaves numerous cousins, nieces, nephews, and her dear cousin Nikolaos Ziozis in Flushing, NY.

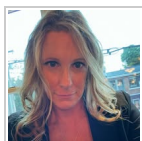
