North Hampton - Helen L. Hunt, 89, of North Hampton, formerly of Hampton Falls, died Monday, April 29, 2013 at Exeter Hospital.

She was born in Dorchester, MA, June 24, 1923 to the late Oscar and Lucy (Towne) McKenney.

Mrs. Hunt was raised in Dorchester and graduated from Dorchester High School for Girls. She moved to Hampton Falls after high school and worked as an LPN at Exeter Hospital. After relocating to Florida in the early 1960s, she graduated from Daytona Beach Junior College as a Registered Nurse and was a member of the State of Florida Nursing Association.

Helen loved the outdoors and was an active member of the United Methodist Camping Association, Sunshine Chapter #7 of Orlando, FL for over 30 years. She moved back to New Hampshire in July 2008 to be near family and made her home at the Maple Suites in Dover where she was known as the Jigsaw Puzzle Lady. She then moved to an apartment in North Hampton to be with her son. She loved her church and has been an active member of the Hampton United Methodist Church.

Helen is survived by her children, Barry Hunt, Esther D. Martin, and Mona R. Merriam (husband, John), granddaughters Destini and Sharina Martin and Mallory and Rebecca Merriam, all of Florida, and many nieces and nephews. She was predeceased by her husband, Richard E.
