August 4, 1918 - February 26, 2025

Henrietta Elizabeth "Betty" Klefbeck, of Rye, formerly of Hampton Falls, passed away peacefully on Wednesday, February 26, 2025, at Websters at Rye. She was 106 years old.

Born in Newburyport, MA, on August 4, 1918, Betty was the daughter of the late Forest and Natalie (Bailey) Chase. Raised and educated in Hampton Falls, Betty attended high school in Hampton. Upon graduating, she and one of her classmates continued their education, traveling daily on the train to Boston. Betty graduated from a two-year secretarial course at Burdett College. She
