July 30, 1925 - January 12, 2020

Rye – John C. “Jack” Squires, 94, of Rye, died Sunday January 12, 2020 at Webster at Rye Assisted Living after a period of failing health. He was born July 30, 1925 in Newport, RI a son of the late Esker I. and Mary Frances (Hagerty) Squires.

Mr. Squires served 36 years with the US Air Force, retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel. He was a veteran of WWII, Korea and Vietnam.

A resident of Rye for many years, he served the town as a part time police officer, acting and assistant building inspector, clerk of the sewer commission and recycling center, member of the Budget Committee and the Zoning Board of Adjustments. He was the founder of the Swap Shop, a member of the Rye Lions Club, and communicant of St. Theresa Church. He was the lead Engineer for the building of the Parish Center at St. Theresa’s Church as well as overseeing the many functions that occurred there.

He was the loving husband of the late Irene A. (Shade) Squires who predeceased him in 2014.

Family members include his son, Mark F. Squires and his wife Valerie of Victor, NY, his daughter, Marisa Jarvis and her husband Bob of Pembroke, two grandchildren, Andrea Squires and husband Nate Meyers; Timothy Squires

and wife Erin Connolly Squires, and many nieces and nephews.

In addition to his parents he was predeceased by his brothers Frank, George and William Squires.

He took us all to the Officer's club for Bingo. I won a game but was so disappointed that it was for 7 bottles of booze. When I went to claim the MC asked about me and who I was with. I proudly said Captain Squires, who was in The Radar Bomb Scoring unit. The boos that came was startling. It was a SAC base with two bomber wings, whose proficiency was measured by Jack's unit. In later life Jack would delight in relating the story of my two disappointments in one evening.*

Through the years his help was always there. When courting my wife I would stay with them in Portsmouth, as they were close to her home. After we were married I departed for Vietnam and he provided security. This ran from telling a landlord that his comments were not appropriate to locks on the door to watching over her until I returned.

Colonel Squires was truly a great individual, and we will miss his counsel. He and his whole family are the picture book of service to our country in uniform and life. I am so proud to call him my brother-in-law. He will truly be missed. Some say you are measured by the dash in life you have left. Jack's was very long.

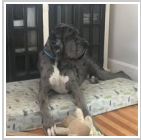
