



Jackson G. Simpson

Hampton- Jackson G. “Jack” Simpson, 86, passed away peacefully, November 23, 2022 at Portsmouth Regional Hospital surrounded by family members.

Jack was predeceased by his first wife Susan (Silberberg) Simpson, who passed away in June of 2011, after 52 years of marriage. He is survived by his second wife Bobbi Cheever and will be lovingly remembered by her.

He was born December 12, 1935 in Elyria, OH. After graduating from high school, Jackson enlisted in the U.S. Army. He served as a security translation officer and continued his career in the U.S. Air Force, where he trained in California learning Polish. He was then stationed in HOF an der Saale, Germany, as an intelligence officer.

Jack and Susan traveled extensively throughout the United States and Europe and had a brief stay in Israel for five years before returning to New Hampshire for 45 years where he resided until his passing. Jackson was also a successful Real Estate broker for 35 years and owner of Jackson Simpson Real Estate located in downtown Hampton.

Later in life, Jackson and Bobbi relished their time they spent on vacations, and eventually at their home in Spring Hill, FL as well as Hampton. Jack loved

his community, his neighbors and his friends. He was a very caring man known by many in the community and enjoyed life to his fullest.

He and his previous wife Susan were avid supporters to the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute, Saint Jude Children's Research Hospital, as well as the New Hampshire SPCA. Jack and Susan did not have any children, however they had German Shepherd dogs they loved dearly.

In addition to his wife, Jack is survived by his sister, Roxanne Schuchman and her husband Robert of Midway, GA, his cousin Nancy Cook of Cleveland Ohio, brothers-in-law Alan Silberberg brother-in-law and wife Susan of MA, Robert Kaminski of Peabody MA, sister-in-law Claire Przada and husband James of St. Louis, MO, stepson Shawn Cheever and step granddaughter, Skyla Cheever of FL who he cherished dearly, his dear friends Clifford and Merav Narunsky of DE, and many nieces and nephews.

He was predeceased by his mother Lois Terrell and siblings, Derek Simpson, Ruby Blakley and Alice Norris all originally from Ohio.
