Exeter – James F. Brown, 91, of Exeter, former longtime resident of Hampton, died Monday, January 27, 2014 at Langdon Place where he made his home the past 4 years.

He was born November 19, 1922 in Newburyport, Mass., a son of the late Herbert and Emily (Oliver) Brown.

Mr. Brown was a veteran of WW II serving with the US Army in the chemical warfare division and participated in the battles of Normandy, Rhineland and Ardennes.

In his earlier years he was employed as a foreman for the former Welpro Shoe Company and later owned and operated the Exeter Dairy Queen for many years retiring in 1984.

He was a member of the Raymond E. Walton American Legion Post 70 of Seabrook.

He shared nearly 68 years of marriage with his wife Sylvia (Roberts) Brown of Exeter.

In addition to his wife, family members include two sons, Ron Brown and his

wife Linda of Temple City, Calif., Terry Brown and his wife Susan of Rollinsford, his daughter, Suzanne Gaudette and her husband Robert of Brentwood, five grandchildren, six great grandchildren, many nieces and nephews.
