Chocorua - James Robert Clough, 64, of Chocorua, passed from this life on September 15, 2014, with the rising sun and his family by his side.

He was born on March 11, 1950 in Portsmouth, the son of the late Robert E. and Leone (McCarron) Clough.

Jim grew up in the seacoast area and graduated from Winnacunnet High School in Hampton in 1969. After service in the United States Navy, he relocated to Los Angeles with his wife, Lynne, where they lived for ten years. He and Lynne returned to New Hampshire in the 1980s and, after a memorable stint as an innkeeper, embarked on a new profession in radiologic technology. His only child, and life's greatest joy, was born while he was a student at New Hampshire Technical Institute. Jim's career as an MRI Technologist led him to work at a number of NH and Maine health facilities, including Wentworth-Douglass and Frisbee Hospitals and most recently at Goodall Hospital in Sanford, ME.

Known as a doer, not a talker, he was a man of quiet dignity, deeply dedicated in so many areas of his life – family, work, and home. Jim was a person who loved the outdoors and outdoor activities including skiing, hiking, kayaking, biking, and walks with his family and dogs. He thought of his ritual Sunday morning bike ride as his source of worship and spiritual renewal.

Jim is survived by his wife of over 42 years, Lynne (Blackburn) Clough of Chocorua, his daughter, Devon Clough of Portland, ME, as well as numerous relatives and good friends. In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by his sister, Susan (Clough) Smith.

A celebration of Jim's life will be held at 3 PM on Tuesday, September 23, 2014 at The Little White Church, 2371 Eaton Rd. (RT 153), Eaton Center, NH. It was like if time had jumped ahead but we were still bros. He was a good man and I'm proud to say that we were friends.
