Lee – James P. "Jimbo" Dowhan, 63, of Lee, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, June 1, 2021.

Raised in Granby, CT, he graduated from Granby High School with the Class of 1976. 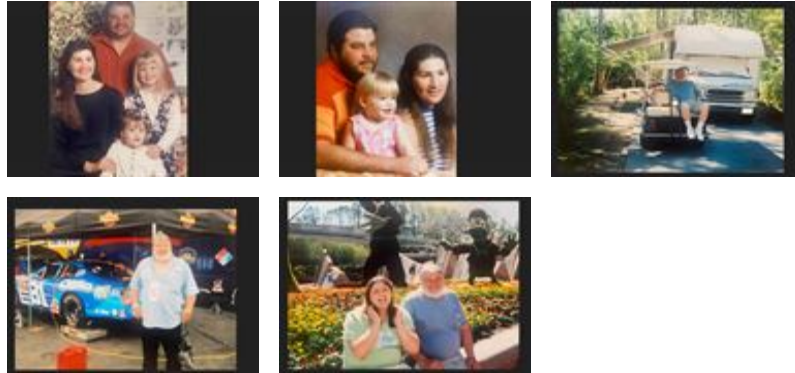
