Salisbury, MA – Jeffrey W. Daniels, 78, of Salisbury, MA, passed away at home on Tuesday, July 1, 2025 surrounded by family. Married 55 years, he was the devoted husband of Dolores “Chila” (Lupi) Daniels.

“ Jeff was my brother in law. For many years we were not close. I think we were wary of each other. Jeff was always very quiet and shy with all of his in laws. I think he was overwhelmed by us. There were too many of us, and some of us, especially me, were too boisterous. Chila has always been most stable and constant of the family and we all would gravitate towards her whenever we were near. Jeff tolerated the latin temperaments, and especially the invasion of his house, always without any comments, a gracious host indeed. So most of us continued to visit over the years, parents -in-law, siblings, cousins, etc., and Chila and Jeff always quietly welcomed us. Then, suddenly after his bout with cancer Jeff became talkative, friendly and openly affectionate. It was a revelation to me and to his immediate family as well. Somebody had switched my brother-in-law from a quiet, pensive guy to someone who shared his thoughts. One night, on one of my visits and after a couple of glasses of wine, we were talking and laughing like never before, and suddenly, very unexpectedly, Jeff got up and came over to me and gave me the most affectionate bear hug I have ever received. I was stunned, incredibly happy and touched , like never before in my whole life. It was a breakthrough moment for me in many ways. Something I would never had expected in our relationship and from that day, until his death we talked often when I called Chila. He opened up with me and shared his thoughts and the many hobbies and interests he had. For that, I am extremely grateful. I wish that I had had the privilege of sharing this side of him many years earlier. Too much time was lost. I miss him.
