



## John A. Lindquist

January 24, 1937 - October 15, 2014

Hampton – Master Chief Petty Officer John A. Lindquist, United States Navy, (Ret.), 77, of Hampton, passed away on Wednesday, October 15, 2014 at home, after a courageous battle with cancer.

John was born in Green Bay, Wisconsin on January 24, 1937, a son of the late William and Evelyn (Allen) Lindquist.

John married his beloved wife, Mary (Nelson) Lindquist in 1956. A dedicated veteran, John served aboard submarines for nearly 20 years which included 15 strategic deterrent patrols on nuclear ballistic submarines. He retired as a Master Chief Petty Officer in 1974 while serving as Chief of the Boat onboard the USS Robert E. Lee (SSBN-601).

After retiring from the Navy, John worked as a maintenance manager at Proctor & Gamble and Scott Paper. He and Mary moved to Hampton in 1997. In addition to Mary J. Lindquist of Hampton, his wife of over 58 years, John is survived by his three children; Scott Lindquist and his longtime companion, Kathy Krupa of Omaha NE, Mitchell Lindquist and his wife Agata of Columbia SC, and Kerry Lindquist and his wife C.J. of Grand Rapids MI.

Private graveside services with full military honors will be held in the New Hampshire State Veterans Cemetery. In lieu of flowers, memorial donations
