Hampton - Joseph F. St. George, 80, died July 9th, 2022, after a long battle with cancer. He passed at his Hampton, New Hampshire home, surrounded by his family.

Mr. St. George was born April 26th, 1942 in Burlington, VT, to Joseph and Frances (Potvin) St. George. He is survived by Suzanne (Campbell) St. George, his loving and devoted wife of 55 years.

In his younger years, Joseph was an all-star baseball pitcher, and a first chair clarinetist. He went on to graduate in 1964 with a bachelor's degree in economics from The University of Vermont. He was a Data Programming Specialist in the U.S. Air Force, and eventually became Founder and President of Computer Products of Vermont. Joseph had many hobbies and interests that included spending time with his family, coaching baseball, and playing table tennis. He was also an avid cribbage and poker player.

Joe's sense of humor and wit will be missed by anyone who had the pleasure of knowing him. Making people laugh gave him great joy.

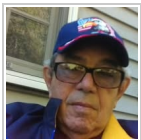
