



Josephine Weston

October 29, 1911 - May 25, 2013

Exeter - Josephine M. Weston, 101, widow of Paul Weston, passed away on Saturday, May 25, at RiverWoods of Exeter. She was born in North Hampton on October 29, 1911, the daughter of the late Russell D. and Edythe (Coffin) Moulton.

She graduated from Portsmouth High School with the Class of 1928, and later from Burdett College. She worked as a secretary in Boston for several years prior to World War II, marrying Paul Weston in February, 1942. Shortly thereafter, he joined the U.S. Army and was stationed overseas for most of the war. After the war, they spent several more years in Boston before moving to New Jersey to co-manage the Far Hills branch of The Country Store of Concord. During the 1960s, they also managed the summer branch in Edgartown, Massachusetts. After retirement in the late 1960s, Jo devoted her time to homemaking and charitable organizations.

After Paul's passing, she moved to RiverWoods in 2005 to be closer to her family. In October, 2011 she celebrated her 100th birthday with family and friends, and was awarded Exeter's Boston Post Cane in April, 2013.

Jo is survived by her sister Jane Olson and nephew Gary Olson of North Hampton; niece Penelope Murley of Long Island, Maine; nephew Steven Moulton of Melbourne, Florida; four grand nieces and nephews and two great-grand nieces. In addition to her husband and parents, she was predeceased by her brother, Gilman M. Moulton, and niece, Christina Stephenson.
