Seabrook – Judith B. MacLean, 85, of Seabrook, passed away peacefully on Wednesday, June 25, 2025.

Judith was born in Amesbury, MA, on June 7, 1940, the daughter of the late Frank and Mary Jane (Souther) Collins. She was raised in Salisbury, MA, and was a graduate of Amesbury High School, Class of 1958. Following high school, she attended Burdett College where she studied to become a secretary.
