Hampton – Kenneth D. Lord, Jr., 64, of Hampton, died on Thursday, April 28, 2016 at his home, surrounded by loving family, after a courageous struggle with cancer.

Kenneth was born on January 6, 1952 in Exeter, a son of the late Kenneth D. and Alice C. (Bramley) Lord, Sr.

He was a lifelong resident of Hampton and a 1970 graduate of Winnacunnet High School. An electrician by trade, Ken had been employed with G.T.E Sylvania of Greenland, California Products Corp. of Cambridge MA, Longchamps Electric of Manchester, and most recently for Brady Sullivan Properties of Manchester before falling ill.

Ken loved the outdoors. He was an avid hunter and fisherman and an expert bow hunter as evidenced by the many trophies on the walls of his home. He was a member of Granite State Bow Hunters, White Mountain Traditional Bow Hunters, and the International Bow Hunters Organization where he had competed in the World Bow Hunting Championship Tournament held in Ellicottville, NY. Ken and his brother Ron earned their pilot's licenses from the Hampton Airfield

when they were 18 years old and enjoyed many trips around the country in Ken's 1946 Luscombe 8A airplane.

He leaves his beloved daughter, Andrea Lord and her fiancé David Hinxman of Hampton and his brothers, Ronald Lord and his wife Maureen of Hampton and David Lord of Portsmouth. He is also survived by his nieces, Cary Bowman and her husband Steve and Jody Mueller and her husband Kurt, his nephews, Chris Lord and his wife Bridget and Bill Lord and his wife Julie. He also leaves many great nieces and great nephews and cousins. Ken will be sorely missed by his family and his many friends.
