Amesbury, MA – Kevin Joseph Field, 70, of Amesbury, formerly of Boxford, MA, passed away peacefully on Monday, February 23, 2015 at the Merrimack Valley Health Center in Amesbury after a long struggle with Alzheimer's disease. His beloved family was at his bedside. He was the son of the late James E. and Catherine (O'Neill) Field.

Kevin was raised in Squantum and graduated from Quincy High School. He went on to earn his Bachelor's and Master's Degrees in Mechanical Engineering from Northeastern University and worked at General Electric Aircraft Engine Division for over 34 years. He relocated from Boxford to Amesbury in 2007.
