Newmarket – Kevin J. Redington, 49, of Newmarket, formerly of Hampton, died Tuesday, May 24, 2022 at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston after a period of failing health. He was born in Everett, MA July 19, 1972 a son of Beverly J. (Boudreau) Redington of Newmarket and the late Paul E. Redington.

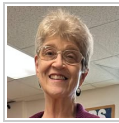
