North Hampton, NH – Laurence Lavery, 72, of North Hampton, entered into rest peacefully on his birthday, Tuesday, May 12, 2015 at his home with loving family at his side.

Born in Brookline, MA, where he was raised by his grandparents John Patrick Lavery and Katherine (McGee) Lavery, mother Margaret Lavery Lyons and their large family. Laurence attended St. Mary's grammar school and was a graduated from Brookline High.

He proudly served in the United States Army during the Vietnam conflict.

Mr. Lavery worked for Sears for more than 40 years. 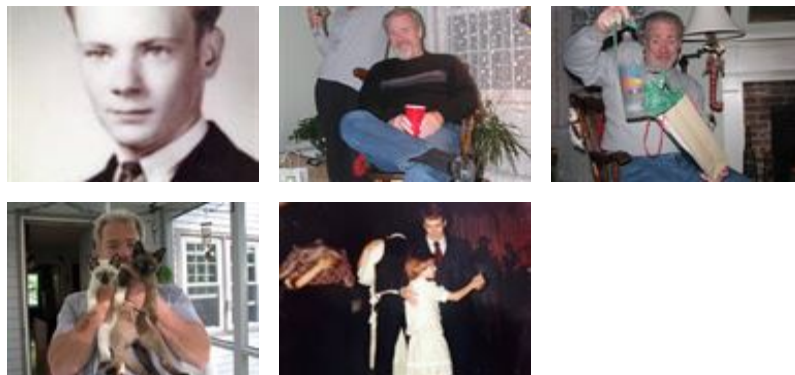
