Hampton – Our dearly loved Leo Sack lost a gallant battle on September 29, 2024, surrounded by his family. He will be greatly missed by all.

He was the loving husband of Patricia (Smith) Sack and is survived by his children, Carl Sack and his wife Paula of Meredith, Gary Sack and his wife Karen of Raymore, MO, Tedd Sack and his husband Paul Smelstor of Peabody, MA, Lary Sack and his wife Margaret of Hampton, and Lisa Parker and her husband Matt of Hampton. He is also survived by his 12 grandchildren, Fawn, Grayson, Nicholas, Christopher, Jacob, Maddison, Devan, Lydia, Sierra, Quinn, Bryce, and Cole. Leo also leaves 11 great grandchildren, Lincoln, Ryker, Harper, Owen, Fiona, Emily, Madison, Katy, Ava, Damien, and Eliza.

In addition to his parents, Leo is predeceased by his siblings, his twin brother Louis Sack, Norbert Sack, Henry Sack, Fred Sack, Dorothy Wilson and Mildred Sack. He is also predeceased by two grandchildren, Kyle Sack and Myla Parker.

Born on a farm in Holden, MO on March 8, 1930, Leo was the son of the late

Otto and Mary

“Leona” (Kassing) Sack. Born a twin and one of seven siblings, Leo came into this

world a kind person and remained so for the rest of his life. Growing up on a farm he said they

never went without. And served as his training ground, where he learned to repair just about

anything. Leo was DIY way before it was mainstream.

As young boys, he and twin brother, Louis, were assigned the task of arriving at their one room

schoolhouse early on winter mornings to start the wood stove. It was the only job he ever

complained about.

Leo enlisted in the Navy at 18 and fondly reminisced of his travels around the world, highlighted

by a papal visit. While stationed in Boston, Leo met the love of his life at a dance, and that

chance encounter led to an incredible 72-year marriage.

Pat and Leo eventually settled in New Hampshire, where he began his career as an electronics

specialist with the Federal Aviation Administration. He supported all his children's ventures no

matter how lame they may have been and never missed an opportunity to cheer us on. He was

keen to take us on fishing trips to Bear Brook State Park where we caught slews of brook trout,

while he spent his day untangling our lines with little complaint. It's said he never swore a day in

his life.

A devoted community leader, Leo served on the Hooksett School Board and was actively involved in the Hooksett Youth Athletic Association and Knights of Columbus.

He retired at 55, but never stopped working. Even into his 90's, he could be found picking apples, painting a fence, sealing the driveway, or resodding the lawn.

He loved his grandchildren deeply and made each feel uniquely valued. Leo modeled for them a quiet strength and humility. Especially fond memories are camping trips to Jellystone Park and helping make Leo's homemade applesauce.

Leo was a darn good golfer and bowler, but never boasted about it. At 91, he had an impressive hole-in-one at Pease Golf Course, where he was a member for many years. This landed him on the front page of the sports section, much to his surprise.

In recent months, it was difficult not helping, as he always had. Instead, he quietly expressed gratitude for the love and support he was receiving. In his last days, he led us by his faith, knowing that his final journey was with God.

Family and friends will gather to honor and remember Leo for a funeral Mass on Friday, October

4, 2024, at 11:00 a.m. at Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal Parish, 289 Lafayette Rd, Hampton, NH 03842. Burial will take place on Tuesday, October 8, 2024 at 10:00 a.m. at the New Hampshire State Veterans Cemetery 110 Daniel Webster Hwy, Boscawen, NH 03303.
