Rochester - Loretta (Gosselin) (Harrington) Campbell. Died at 85 on March 22, 2024 losing her struggle with Cancer.

She went back to college in her 40's and received her degree in Computer Science which led to a career as IT manager with D.G.O Brian, Inc. of Seabrook, NH. During the folk music era, she learned to play the guitar and sang the folk music of the time. She loved cooking gourmet dinners for friends and family.

Upon retiring, she and her husband, Peter, moved to Rochester, NH. and spent much of their time at their cottage on Province Lake in Effingham, NH. She always advocated exercising and eating healthy and also kindness. She enjoyed being outdoors golfing,

biking, sailing, hiking, snowshoeing, skiing and kayaking. In her spare time, she took classes in photography and Early American Decorative painting. Being an avid reader, she thoroughly enjoyed book discussion group at the Rochester Public Library and loved learning about everything. When asked why would she want to know about something, her response was always "It's knowledge- everything is related".
