Rye Beach – Louis G. "Lou" Altman, 52, of Rye Beach, died Sunday, July 2, 2017 at Portsmouth Regional Hospital with his loving wife and family by his side after a valiant effort to conquer cancer.

He was born January 9, 1965 in White Plains, NY a son of the late Barry and Helen (Jacobs) Altman.

Lou was raised in White Plains, NY and graduated from Rye Country Day School in Rye, NY, and graduated from New England College in 1988. He served as Social Chairman and Pledge Chairman in his fraternity Sigma Phi Delta. He made countless life-long friendships at New England College and continued to advise the Sigma Phi Delta brotherhood for years after his graduation. Lou later received his Master's degree in business.

He was an entrepreneur in the satellite-communications industry at Globafone (established on April Fool's Day in 1998), and a gifted trainer, promoting best customer service practices.

An "international man of mirth", he participated in many activities, such as: FIRST Robotics, Con Tutti!, church choir at UCC North Hampton, body building at MaxEdge Fitness (in Hampton, NH), Penguin Plunge, athletics (enjoying: hockey, racquetball, lacrosse and ballroom dance), loving animals, motorcycling, beach going (goal of 90 days every summer), avid gardening, grilling (Self-proclaimed master: he backed it up too!), philanthropy (generously giving of his time and money on a regular basis), singing and-a prayin' (deeply spiritual), proud-and-devoted fathering, and, of course, pirate impersonation.

Lou shared 16 years of "love, fun and adventure" with the love of his life and "Sweetie Pie", Amy Dee Pruszenski Altman.

In addition to his wife, he leaves his daughter, Madeline Raie Altman of Old Town, ME, his son, Alexander Altman of Barrington, his brother, Peter Altman and his wife Sabrina of Maryland, their children, Abigail and David, his sister, Devorah Altman of Beit Shemesh, Israel and her children, Yori, Avraham Zvi, and Racheli Thau, and his puppy cat, Rocky, of Rye Beach.
