



## Marie T. "Terry" Duquette

December 10, 1930 - June 23, 2022

Seabrook – Marie T. “Terry” Duquette,” Forever 39” of Seabrook, NH and a former resident of North Cambridge, MA, passed away peacefully on Thursday, June 23, 2022 with family at her side. Terry was born In North Cambridge, MA on December 10, 1930, the daughter of the late Germano “Tony” and Mary “Stella” (Pelletier) Renzi. She shared over 56 years of a loving marriage with her late husband, Donald (Duke) J. Duquette, who died in 2008.

Terry was raised in North Cambridge and graduated from Notre Dame High School in 1948. After high school, she went to work for the W. R. Grace Company in Cambridge. Terry and Duke were married in 1952 and raised their family in Cambridge where she grew up. Terry worked part-time for the Divine Word Missionary in Boston while her children were younger and returned to W. R. Grace after her children left home. While in Cambridge, Terry was a faithful communicant of St. John’s Church in Cambridge where she loved being “the church greeter” and was very actively involved in the many activities there.

She loved all kinds of music and loved to dance, often being the last one off the dance floor. She had a zest for life and was full of energy. Her family meant the world to her and was the most important part of her life. She was devoted to them and would often say “you put your family first, above

everything” or “family is everything.”

After retiring from W. R. Grace where she worked for 29 years, she continued to maintain friendships and enjoyed her monthly luncheons with “The Grace Girls.”

She leaves behind her sons, Richard Duquette and his wife Sharon of Seabrook, NH and their three children David Duquette and his wife Lindsay, Nicole Herrick and her husband Caleb, Danielle Coleman and her husband Zach and her son Donald Duquette and his wife Elizabeth of Tampa, FL and their children Kimberly and her husband John Alexander, and Brittany Duquette. She had 14 great grandchildren and 1 great-great grandchild.

In addition to her parents and her husband, Terry was predeceased by her grandson, Kevin Duquette, her brother, Henry Renzi and her longtime companion, John Reddig.

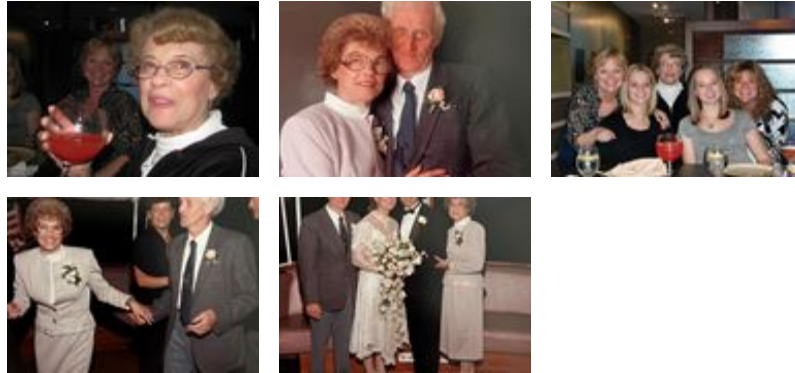
